Dear parishioners

First of all, let me say a very belated "thank you" for all your Christmas cards and good wishes. I also want to thank you for your cards and get well notes these past few weeks. In addition, several of you have made meals for me, cleaned my house and laundry, cared for me at home, and taken me to various appointments, etc. Your prayers and on-going support have been edifying and so immensely helpful.

I wanted to write a brief update on how I'm doing and how I got to where I am. I went skiing the Tuesday after Christmas with my brothers and nephews. One of my nephews went off a jump, and I said to myself, "I can do better than that!" Well I didn't. I took the jump, and when I was ten feet off the ground I thought to myself, "Well this was stupid." I landed straight down on my left leg and proceeded to fracture the tibia right at the knee. I broke off the inside of the tibial plateau and the femur made a huge divot on the other side.

I ended up having a surgery two days later (New Year's Eve) down in Olympia where they put in a plate and a few screws. I was released from the hospital after five days, and I returned to Bellingham. Two weeks later I had a second surgery up here at St. Joseph's. They ended up putting in another plate and a few more screws (to those who thought I had a screw loose, they can't say it anymore).

I was told that I can't put any weight on my left leg for twelve weeks. I've been basically home bound since the surgery. I can get up and around on a walker, but haven't been able to do too much getting around. Every day is a little bit better, and I plan to ease back into parish ministry this coming week. I hope to celebrate the Ash Wednesday mass this week at 7 pm and then a couple masses the following weekend. I still can't drive, but slowly but surely I plan to attend more meetings and get back into the office.

Please have patience with me and pray that I have patience with myself and this process. I'm as frustrated with this issue as all of you are. We never know when something is going to be thrown in our path which quickly alters the course of our life. But we do have the opportunity to approach it with the best attitude we can and make the most out of a bad situation.

Fr. John Madigan recently said, "Why ski? You're already going downhill fast enough." I plan to be up on the slopes next year. I love to ski and I'm good at it (although the past month might not indicate it). I will promise, however, no more jumps!


