
April 10, 2016 Third Sunday of Easter

Someone said to me recently (ok, it was Joan Pape, the founder of Hope House and a valuable mentor!)—"Hunger doesn't end when winter is gone." So true! When your budget is minimal, your job is part time with no benefits and your children are hungry, any food is welcome. Summer is a difficult time for families because children who are out of school for the summer now have no free breakfast or lunch to eat. Young moms tell me all summer how hard it is to keep their children fed with the minimal food stamps they get.

Hope House offers emergency food bags of approximately a one day supply of canned goods, as well as food bags of items that require no cooking for the homeless. For families that are in housing, we serve the area outside of Bellingham only, because Bellingham residents have a wonderful Food Bank just one block away from us to access. Those who live in Sumas, Deming and Maple Falls have limited food banks to access and a long wait between open times (sometimes only once per month).

(sometimes only once per month). So why am I telling you all of this (besides the obvious plea for donations as usual)? I am thanking you for your Rice Bowl contributions this Lenten season. Hope House receives two grants from the Rice Bowl money each year—one for our food bags and one for our homeless lunches. Without this money, we would have a very limited food outreach. Bless you for your thoughtfulness and generosity!
