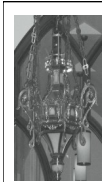

## LIVING THE EUCHARIST AFTER LENT

Does your Living the Eucharist small faith sharing group want to continue meeting past Lent? If you do and you're uncertain about how to proceed, here are a few suggestions: Focus on the Sunday Gospel reading in the Lectio Divina format similar to Living the Eucharist or start reading and discussing books about Christian spirituality or view and discuss videos about Christian spirituality. For more details consider these formats and resources recommended by some of our own parishioners.

### **Lectio Divina for small groups:**

Time frame: 1 hour.

Opening song usually chosen to complement theme of the Gospel.

Opening prayer.

Gospel read for 1st time.

Anyone may comment on Gospel, but there is no cross talk.

Gospel read for 2<sup>nd</sup> time.

Anyone may comment on Gospel, but there is no cross talk.

Gospel read for 3<sup>rd</sup> time

Anyone may comment on Gospel or on what anyone else has said.

Intercessory prayers.

Closing prayer and final song.

Options:

Simple meal and/or refreshments may be offered either before or after service. If offered before the service, then a focus question may be offered for reflection and discussion while breaking bread.

The 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> reading for Sunday may be substituted for Gospel reading.

**A Stewardship Moment**

When Jesus heard about the illness of His friend, Lazarus, He responded, "This illness is not to end in death; rather it is for God's glory, that through it the Son of God may be glorified." Every aspect of our lives — our gifts as well as our suffering — can, if surrendered to Christ, lead to blessing for others and ourselves.
