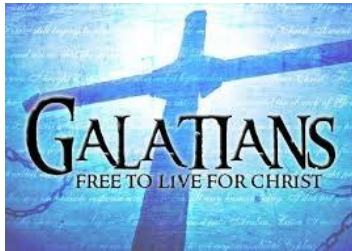

## Come meet Olivier Ndikumana—July 9 at 6:15 pm

I am Olivier Ndikumana, and I am originally from Rwanda. One of the traditional African sayings is that nobody knows what tomorrow will look like. With my experience of the Rwandan genocide, and other horrible atrocities, I know this is true. However, I also know that tomorrow can be better than today because every single day is a blessing from God. For instance, I am now in Bellingham, but what about tomorrow....

In Rwanda, I learned to accept unity and reconciliation as healing processes for all of us who experienced the trauma and tragedy of this chaotic period. I led different programs that reconciled and reunited young people, regardless of whether their families participated in the genocide or were victims of it. However, I also believed that truth must accompany reconciliation. As a result of this work, my life-dream to work for the United Nations came true and I was hired as a UN volunteer to help disarm and reconcile former rebels in the Cote d'Ivoire (Ivory Coast) so that peace can be sustained in that country.

Later June 2016, I was informed that I have been admitted to the Masters' program in Applied International Studies at the Jackson School of the University of Washington and have been awarded a partial scholarship for fall 2016. I am really excited to announce this achievement, though many challenges remain for me because I have to secure housing and the remaining tuition and fees. I am therefore humbly asking you to help me fundraise and to secure the funds and scholarships I need to enroll in this intensive, one-year program. I also wish to offer to provide lectures or to talk and discuss with you topics related to my experience. I would be delighted to talk with you about these or other topics:

***Living as Christian in the unity and reconciliation period after the Rwandan genocide;*** during the genocide, people were killed in churches and some catholic churches remain as genocide memorial sites. An Italian nun, Antonia Locatelli along with others national and international priests and nuns were murdered and others have been accused of participating in the genocide. ***Investigative journalism and untold stories;*** we investigated numerous crimes that occurred in Rwanda after the genocide and other mass killing occurred in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Does true reconciliation and peace require that the truth be told about such events, even if it is painful?

***Hope and faith in troubled times.*** I lived through the Rwandan genocide as a young boy and have seen unbelievable violence and evil. But I believe international peace and reconciliation efforts can work and that the church has an important role in such efforts. One of Yours in Christ,
