I wanted to give you a brief update on some of the things that have transpired in the last few weeks. I am pleased to let you know that she accepted another position as principal of St. Frances Cabrini Catholic School in Lakewood (near Tacoma). She will be much closer to her daughters and grandchildren who live in the area. I am grateful to her for her four years of service to our community of faith here at Assumption, and I wish her well in this new endeavor.

With such short notice, it was extremely difficult for me to put a search committee together at the end of the school year and to give the proper time and attention to such an important task. In addition to several years as an administrator for the Bellingham School District, he also worked as parish administrator at St. Paul's Episcopal Church here in Bellingham.

Bill has been very involved in our parish in a variety of leadership roles. In addition to helping lead our recent successful Capital Campaign, he has served as part of the executive committee on our Parish Pastoral Council. Mr. Attebery graciously agreed to help out this next year, and I know he will be successful with your prayers and support.

Both Bill and I will continue to keep you informed. I pray God's blessing be upon you and your families this summer.
