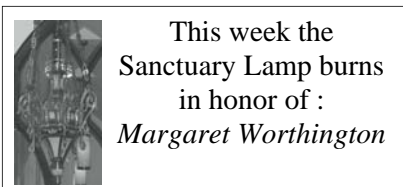

It's getting colder outside—the nights are chilly and the days cold and windy. Our clients are coming in for warm sweaters and sweatshirts, socks, hats and gloves, boots and jeans---surprisingly, they don't need shorts, sandals and tank tops! However, that is what we have been receiving lately. I think it is time to remind everyone of what we DON'T need/accept at Hope House:

- Clothing---no used underwear, dirty looking socks, out of season clothing, shirts with inappropriate words/pictures on them. No clothing that smells of cigarettes.
- House wares---no computers, encyclopedias, large TV's or microwaves. No blankets that smell of animals or cigarettes.
- Hygiene--- we cannot accept used/opened bottles of shampoo, conditioner, and body wash, etc. We also do not take used hair brushes.
- Food---Please, no rusted or dented cans, and no out of date food (we have had some from 2003!)
- Misc.---games, puzzles and toys should have ALL their parts, coloring books should not be used, stuffed animals should be clean. We do not accept R-rated movies or music.

Here's what we DO need:

- Clean, warm clothing for all ages/sizes!
- Clean, warm blankets, towels and sheets. Dishes, kitchen utensils and silverware, etc.
- New bottles of shampoo, conditioner and body wash; bars of soap, tubes of toothpaste and TOILET PAPER (our #1 requested household item); dish detergent.
- Canned fruit, veggies, tuna, chicken, soup, chili; boxes of crackers and cereal, Mac & cheese.
- Diapers of all sizes, baby wipes, baby shampoo & powder
- Your prayers and thoughts for Hope House.
