1. Attend monthly Confirmation meetings

Part of being an active and growing member of the faith is taking time to deepen your understanding of Church teachings and engage in regular conversations and prayer with others in the faith. Our monthly Confirmation meetings help develop both of these. During these gatherings you will engage in conversations about our faith and how to live it more fully in your everyday life and will gain a support system of peers who are on the same journey as you.

2. Choose a Sponsor: DUE JANUARY 8, 2022

Who Can Be a Sponsor? According to the Code of Canon Law (893, 874), a sponsor is someone chosen by the candidate who must be a practicing Catholic in good standing with the Church, at least 16 years of age, who has been confirmed and has already received the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist and who leads a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on. Also, if married, the Sponsor needs to have been married in the Catholic Church. Parents cannot be sponsors for their children. It is encouraged, though not required, to ask a Godparent to be the Confirmation Sponsor so as to complete the Candidate's initiation into the faith that began in Baptism (Canon 893.2).

Responsibilities of the Sponsor

"The sponsor is to take care that the confirmed person behaves as a true witness of Christ and faithfully fulfills the obligations inherent in this sacrament." (Code of Canon Law, 892)

Responsibilities of the Sponsor

- Pray for the candidate.
- Help support the <u>candidate</u> to participate fully in preparation for the sacrament: especially in faithfully attending Sunday Mass, faith formation meetings, and receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation at least once before Confirmation.
- Meet with your Candidate at least three times prior to the Confirmation Rehearsal. Meetings can be in person or over the phone.
- Submit the *Sponsor Commitment Form* by **November 22, 2020**.
- Assist with the further formation of the candidate, especially through shared prayer, reading, and discussion.

3. Attend at least 3 separate meetings with sponsor

Confirmandi must meet individually with their chosen sponsor three times before receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation to talk about their faith progress and personal development. Phone calls are sufficient for those that have sponsors who live out of state. You will schedule these meetings on your own time! The purpose of these meetings is to deepen your relationship with your sponsor and invite them to walk alongside you as you prepare for Confirmation.

4. Regularly attend Catholic

The best formation for Christian discipleship is participating in the Sunday Liturgy on a weekly basis. Someone who is ready to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation will be regularly participating in Sunday Mass.

5. YouCat Readings

As part of your formation, you will each receive a YouCat (Catechism of the Catholic Church for Youth). This tool will help you find answers to your questions about the faith and will help form you better understand the ins and outs of Catholicism. Become familiar with how to look up topics using the YouCat, and read/discuss the following paragraphs with a parent or sponsor...

6. Service Component: DUE APRIL 16, 2023

Confirmandi should be active members of our community by finding ways to serve and help those in need. Choose at least one way to serve the community during your Confirmation prep, and write a short (2-4 paragraph) reflection about what you did and what you learned.

7. Confirmation Saint Name: DUE APRIL 16, 2023

8. Parent Involvement

Parents are the primary catechists of their children; it is through parents' influence and guidance that the youth are able to fully live out their call as Catholics. Parents are encouraged to pray regularly for their teens going through Confirmation and to have regular conversations with them about their spiritual growth and how the family can best support them.

We also encourage parents to volunteer with the Confirmation and youth ministry programs. By being involved in these programs, you will gain better insight into what your youth are learning and can engage more fully in conversations about faith with them.

9. Reconciliation

All Confirmandi must receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation 1-4 weeks prior to their Confirmation.

In Holy Scripture, a significant change in one's life is often reflected by taking a new name. For instance, God gave Abram the name Abraham when He promised to make him the father of many nations. Christ gave Simon the name Peter (Rock) when He promised to make Peter the rock on which He would build His Church. So today, Catholics take on a name at Baptism and again at Confirmation.

Confirmation, like the other sacraments, is not a mere symbol. It effects a *real spiritual change*. In order to best reflect one's full initiation into the faith and thus the connection between Baptism and Confirmation, the Candidate is encouraged to be confirmed in his or her baptismal (first) name. However, in order to best prepare for this sacrament, Candidates are asked to select a saint whom he or she can pray with for guidance and support during this period of formation. Each Candidate should choose a saint that he or she can connect with or aspire to imitate in some way.
