

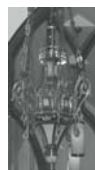

She helped to arrange furniture safely and discussed wheel chair access needs. 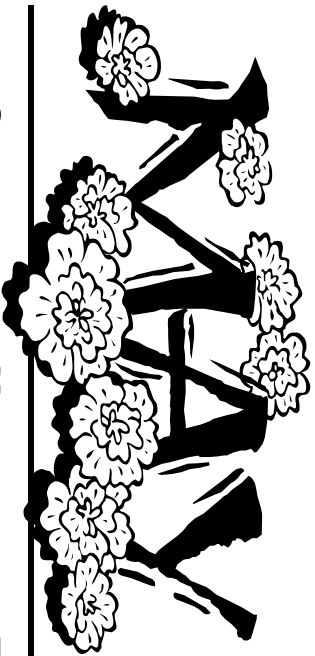

CALLED TO PROTECT – ARE YOU UP TO DATE?

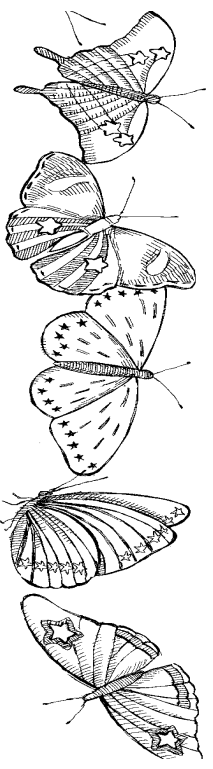


